RECYCLE WEEK


For Recycle Week this year, the Green-led District Council has been sharing the recycling journey from kerbside to specialist processing facilities.

People across North Nibley, Stinchcombe and Wotton, have embraced recycling, with our food waste transformed into liquid fertiliser and gas to power homes, and recycling bin items sorted locally before being processed into new products for the UK market. The new weekly battery and vape collection service has also proved popular, with over a tonne of batteries and 80 kg of vapes collected so far. We're now investing in actions to reduce litter, including new litter bins, and supporting people to repair, reuse, recycle or dispose of household items with the Waste Wizard. https://www.stroud.gov.uk/wastewizard

CHANGES PROPOSED TO **LOCAL GOVERNMENT**



Gloucestershire councils are set to be reorganised under Government plans

The Labour Government has decided that all District and County Councils must be abolished and replaced with new 'unitary authorities'.

While the timescales for these changes to take place are not yet confirmed, all six district councils in Gloucestershire and the County Council will have to put forward their preferred options for council reorganisation by 28 November 2025. It will be for Ministers to undertake a public consultation on the options and to decide which one to take forward. Parish and town councils will not be directly affected by these changes.

The main proposals are for one unitary authority for the whole county (with new 'Neighbourhood Partnerships' covering numerous parishes set up for local engagement) or for two unitary councils for the East and West of the county. Gloucestershire will also need to decide which 'strategic authority' to join for regional government, with the West of England Combined Authority currently preferred.

INVESTMENT FOR HERITAGE, NATURE & REGENERATION

Stroud district has, for many years, been working in partnership with the Cotswolds Canal Trust, National Lottery Heritage Fund, Gloucestershire Wildlife Trust and other groups to restore the Cotswold canals. The project will reconnect the Stroudwater canal to the national canal network at Saul Junction, enhancing biodiversity and promoting the area's historic and cultural heritage.
